Description: A very large, round peach with yellow skin and red overlay and very little fuzz. Yellow flesh with a firm texture. A freestone peach.  Flavour: It has a wonderfully sweet taste and aroma, and is an excellent peach for eating and canning.  Matures mid to late Febraury making it a late season variety.
